Game Notes: No. 2 Jacksonville 51, No. 3 Belmont 49

JACKSONVILLE

* The Dolphins picked up their first win in nine tries against the Bruins in Nashville. Overall, the win is just third for Jacksonville against Belmont in 15 all-time meetings.

* Today's game was the 7th time in which the Dolphins, the conference's stingiest defense, held their opponent to under 50 points. They improve to 6-1 in those games and avenge the lone loss, a 45-43 decision to Belmont on Feb. 28 in the regular-season finale.

BELMONT

* For the second straight year, the Bruins' season ends in similar last-minute heartbreak. In the 2008 Quarterfinals, Lipscomb defeated Belmont with a game-winning jump shot by Katie Woods in the waning seconds.

* Jessica Bobbitt, the lone senior on the team, capped her season with an 18-point, six-rebound, five-block effort. She finished with 290 blocks, 40 more than FIU's Albena Branzov, the former conference record holder.

A-SUN CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

* Jacksonville will take on ETSU in tomorrow's General Shale Brick Atlantic Sun Women's Basketball Championship contest. The two met last season with ETSU pulling out a 75-72 win. This matchup marks the first rematch of a previous year's title game since Georgia State and Campbell met in 2000 and 2001. The Camels won 66-49 in 2000 but the Panthers enacted revenge, 64-62 the following year.

* Through the first six games of the championship, the higher-seeded school has won all six. This event has only occurred once, in 2000. In that final second-seeded Campbell upset No. 1 Georgia State.

* Saturday's final will mark the 10th time the top two seeds will meet for the title. No. 1 seeds own a 7-2 advantage, including ETSU's win last season.
